### **CALL TO ORDER**

The KRADD Regional Transportation Planning Committee meeting was called to order at 11:05 AM by Transportation Planner Eunice Holland. She welcomed those in attendance.

### **SPECIAL PRESENTATION**

John Chester, KRADD GIS/GPS Technician discussed the Cryptolocker Virus Threat. The virus is ransom-ware. When attacked, the virus encrypts your data files and holds them for ransom. You have two chances to pay from \$100 to \$3000 to get a code to release your files. Anti-virus cannot defend you. The virus is passed by emails as an attachment or is disguised as a shipment tracking link from UPS or FedEx. If you have any doubts about an email don't open the attachment. Delete the email.

### **BUSINESS: Eunice Holland, Transportation Planner**

- Bicycle/Pedestrian Survey and Data Collection: The Transportation Cabinet, in an effort to develop a complete transportation system that is inclusive of all modes and users, directs that the ADDs shall: Survey all cities and counties concerning

their Bicycle and/or Pedestrian plans. Those that do not have a bicycle or pedestrian plan but wish to develop one shall also be noted. The Division of Planning, Modal Branch, will provide the survey questions and database to populate the responses. ADDs will document bicycle and pedestrian assets in localities (no more than two per Fiscal Year) as defined and directed by KYTC in each given Fiscal Year. Populate the spatially accurate bicycle and pedestrian asset information in the GIS database provided. KRADD has been tasked to survey 9 cities and to collect data for the city of Jackson and Hazard. The surveys will be completed by December 31<sup>st</sup> and data collection will begin in the spring of 2014.

- The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet requests comments for the Public Participation Process (PPP) for Statewide Transportation Planning. The review period closes Friday, November 15<sup>th</sup>. Mrs. Holland provided a copy of the PPP for review and surveys for members to complete.
- The 36<sup>th</sup> Annual Kentucky Transportation Conference will be held January 9 & 10, 2014 at the Griffin Gate Resort in Lexington. Registration is now open.
- Jason Blackburn from KYTC Highway District Office 10 briefly discussed a public meeting that was held last week. Over 80 residents viewed plans for the KY 30 Planning Study at Highland-Turner Elementary School in Breathitt County November 7, 2013. The study provides alternatives for KY 30 from Booneville to Jackson. Mr. Blackburn also announced the KY 15 Public Meeting scheduled for Thursday, November 14, 2013 from 5-7 PM at Perry County Central High School. A project is under consideration to widen KY 15 between the northern end of the Hazard bypass and the intersection with Morton Boulevard to a four-lane highway. The project would result in a safer route that would be designed to meet current and future traffic demands. Everyone was encouraged to attend.

### **PROJECT UPDATES & CONCERNS:**

#### KYTC Highway District 10:

Jason Blackburn provided updates:

- Breathitt County – Construction at Lakeside will begin in the spring
- Breathitt County – KY 15 new section in Jackson to open all four lanes by the end of November
- Breathitt County – Quicksand bridge almost completed
- Owsley County – KY 30 (Traveler’s Rest) to let for construction in February
- Perry County – Glowmar Bridge letting in November
- Wolfe County – KY 3356 intersection will be let in March for construction

#### KYTC Highway District 11:

Sherri Chappell provided updates for Leslie County:

- Resurfacing finishing this month for various roads
- US 421 slide repairs from the flooding in April are complete

#### KYTC Highway District 12:

Mark Westfall provided updates:

- Letcher County – Section 3A on US 119 will let to construction in December

- Letcher County – Design for the last section (Partridge to Oven Fork) will have finished designs by the summer of 2014
- Letcher County – US 119 was a top priority for the District during this year's prioritization
